

Minutes of 2nd National level Workshop on use of MIS data for Planning and Web Monitoring in Education of Rashtriya Madhyamik Shiksha Abhiyan on 5th -6th March 2013 at Scope Complex New Delhi.

The workshop started with Ms. Caralyn K. Deshmukh, Director, Department of School Education & Literacy, Ministry of Human Resource Development welcoming the participants to the workshop. She also extended welcome to Professor Arun C. Mehta, Head, Educational Management Information System (EMIS), NUEPA. She stated that at the start of RMSA, the data set relating to the scheme was SEMIS. However, with the decision to merge SEMIS with DISE, it is imperative that both the SEMIS and DISE officials work together now that they are UDISE. One of the objectives of this workshop is to bridge the gap between the National level agencies (NUEPA, RMSA / SSA TSG) and the States / UTs on various issues pertaining to DISE/ SEMIS and UDISE. She emphasized on timely, correct, validated and discrepancy-free data. She also pointed out that there is a need for clarity as to what functions/ activities are to be carried out at what level and by what timeline. Correct data (DCF) should be collected/ filled up at the school level, validated at district level and finally checked and certified at state level before sending to the Ministry of HRD/ TSG and NUEPA. Correct data is crucial for effective planning and monitoring. She added that the RMSA TSG has developed a Planning Tool which may be helpful to the States/ UTs in their planning activities, especially with regard to information for Model tables for the Annual Work Plan and Budget. Out of 35 states/ Uts, 5 States viz. Chhattisgarh, Delhi, Gujarat, Lakshadweep and Puducherry could not attend the workshop. Total 71 participants were present.

The list of participants are at Annexure I.

Shri Rajiv Mehra, Senior Consultant, MIS, RMSA TSG shared the Planning Tool with the participants. He demonstrated how to use UDISE / SEMIS data in AWP&B 2013-14 with the help of Planning Tool Software. He also showed the participants how to generate the AWP&B Model Tables from the software using UDISE / SEMIS database and explained how interventions related to quality and equity can be included in the Plan with the help of tables.

Professor Arun C. Mehta NUEPA, in his address mentioned that the date of reference for Unified DISE was 30-09-2012. Almost all the states have transited from DISE/ SEMIS to UDISE . Data entry work has been completed by most of the states, and the validation work is going on. Some of the states have submitted the data to NUEPA although it is provisional . He stated that previously, two Data Capture Formats (DCF) were there: namely DISE DCF for SSA and SEMIS DCF for RMSA. One Data Capture Format (Unified DCF) has been developed now for data collection from classes I- XII. A series of workshop have been conducted in NUEPA for clarifying the basic requirement for unification in DISE and SEMIS. Since the DISE data had been developed in response to the SSA programme and SEMIS to the RMSA programme, and now , since the data is unified, there need to be coherence between SSA and RMSA MIS functionaries. UDISE will have to be a joint effort between SSA and RMSA functionaries . Management and coordination problems are there in some of the states due to various reasons.

He also stated that in the concept of UDISE ,each and every school should have a UDISE code, whether govt, govt aided, private, private aided, local body, Panchayat, municipal, state govt or central govt schools of different Ministries, recognized or unrecognized schools. Each and every school should be covered under UDISE, and UDISE code should be given to all schools including KVS, NVS, Defence / Armed Forces Schools , Paramilitary forces schools, Public Sector Undertaking schools and Tibetan schools. If there are problems and difficulties getting data for these schools, the matter should be taken up with the concerned authorities or brought to the notice of the MHRD and NUEPA. He gave an example that eight schools under the umbrella of Jamia Milia in Delhi were initially not permitted to provide the data. The issue was taken up with the concerned authorities and problem of data collection from these schools was resolved. He advised the States to make constant effort for coverage of all the recognized schools in the country. He informed that as per the provisions of the RTE Act, all unrecognized schools in the country will be closed down by 31st March 2013, other wise Rs. 1000/- to Rs. 10,000/- per day penalty will be imposed for running these schools. A large number of unrecognized schools ,including 5000 Madrasas, exist which are are not covered in the system . He informed that some of the states have not submitted the SEMIS data so far and requested that

this data be submitted soon. SEMIS Flash Statistics for the year 2010-11 and state Report card 2010-11 have been published by NUEPA.

He also informed that the checking work of filled in UDISE formats for the year 2012-13 at Block level, District level and State level is in process. He emphasized on the 5 to 10 percent mandatory sample checking at block and district level. He informed that in the proposed review workshop to be held in June- July 2013, the (DCF) format will be revised if necessary as per the suggestions of the stakeholders, including States, MHRD. He also pointed out that a large number of indicators and variables can be generated from this UDISE software. Many states have appreciated UDISE, however there is a need for examination and analysis of data and the indicators generated from it at the State level.

Professor Mehta suggested the diagnosis/ analysis of data by identifying the locations which are not at par, focus groups, target groups, backward areas should be done at the district level and the State level. Capacity to identify the problems at Block level, District level and State level should be built. Different districts have different problems, Diagnosis should be done at macro level and micro level. Time series data should be prepared. He explained in detail the indicators like Enrolment trend, GER, NER, GPI, Gender Gap, Retention rate, Transition rate, Dropout rate may also be prepared by using charts, Bar Diagram, Pie Chart and Maps. Every table should have table number, title and source, table should be self-explanatory.

He informed that for age wise population, Registrar General of India, New Delhi has been contacted, for age group wise population figures and it was assured that the figures would be made available by 2014. He is also hopeful that a variety of data and indicators will be available from the All India School Education Survey being conducted by NCERT; like school for girls, urban, rural, facilities, in school building, pucca, kuccha, male and females teachers, percentage of trained teachers, science laboratory, other laboratories, library, toiletries, water facilities, etc

Shri Shailender Sharma, Chief Consultant MIS, SSA remarked that the position of collection of data in the current year is better than the previous year. Plan proposals for the year 2013-14 are based on the data 2012-13. He requested all the states/UTs to submit the data for 2012-13 immediately. He advised that time - line calendar should be prepared for submission of data. He

also emphasized on authenticity and correctness of data. Shri Shailender Sharma informed that if data from one state is not received, it will hamper the whole work, therefore it is the responsibility of each and every state to submit the data in time. Child wise data should be collected. Shri Shailender Sharma requested the states for fixing time line for submission of SEMIS data for the year 2011-12 and UDISE data for 2012-13. He desired the state wise status for submission of data.

The state wise status of submission of SEMIS data 2011-12 and UDISE data for 2012-13 is at Annexure III.

The issues raised by the participants and the replies given by TSG members are at Annexure IV.

Shri Naveen Bhatia, System Analyst, NUEPA stated that the data should match with previous year data. State should concentrate their efforts on the UDISE. He also emphasized on checking for internal inconsistencies in data by simple methods ,eg, checking the enrolment should tally with the age specific enrolment. Total number of teachers should tally with qualification and subject wise teachers, etc. He stated that different kind of tools are there for generating reports. He requested the States/ UTs to furnish the SEMIS data and UDISE data at the earliest. All the states assured to submit the data for the year 2012-13 by March/ April 2012-13. He also requested the States / UTs to start the work for the year 2013-14 data. Shri Naveen Bhatia explained in detail about raw data and also welcomed the suggestions if any. He stated that under the UDISE system, state code will be of 2 digit, district code of 4 digit, Block code of 6 digit, village code will be of 9 digit, and school code will be of 11 digit .

Shri Rajiv Mehra, Sr. Consultant,MIS, RMSA said that there is a need to ensure the quality of data in the SEMIS and now UDISE. He shared his experience while working in Uttar Pradesh as a System Analyst for SSA. He stated that States / UTs can cross check for discrepancy by using the three main parameters/ data sets :- Schools, Enrolment and Teachers. These data sets should also be checked internally and against the previous year's data so as to avoid discrepancies and inconsistencies. The high quality of data should be maintained. He emphasized that data should be submitted with Certificate / Signature of SPD. Shri Mehra stated that in case of some states like Bihar, Himachal Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir the district level data was

correct but the discrepancies were observed at the State level. The data of State of Haryana was returned back due to inconsistencies. Shri Rajiv Mehra gave a power point presentation regarding Management Information System (MIS) and stated that UDISE code is required for each and every school proposed to be covered in different schemes like strengthening, new schools in RMSA, ICT@ school, IEDSS, Vocational Education, etc Detailed information is required for every teacher, eg; name of the teacher, date of birth, PAN Number, Category, educational and professional qualification ,etc. He informed that if there is any change in the sanctioned list, the same may be informed immediately. Shri Kalicharan, Consultant, RMSA TSG, explained the formulae for generating the Educational Indicators. He also pointed out the inconsistencies observed in respect of some of the states. The states assured to look in to this and also to make effort to avoid these inconsistencies

Issues/ points which emerged out of discussion and suggestions

- KVS, NVS and private schools are not providing the data.
- Shortage of staff at district and state level.
- 45% time of teachers spend in furnishing information/data, election duty, census survey and other work.
- States will use Planning tool for generating Model Tables for AWP&B work.

Action to be taken :

SEMIS 2011-12

The States of Bihar, Delhi, Gujarat, Haryana, Jammu & Kashmir, Jharkhand, Kerala, Lakshadweep , Madhya Pradesh, Nagaland, Orissa, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh have not submitted their data , they have been suggested to submit correct and validated data by 31st March' 13.

UDISE 2012-13

Discrepancies related to Enrolment, Classrooms, Schools and Teachers have been found in the data of many states. States to ensure that data is cross-checked, made free from inconsistencies and validated before it is sent to NUEPA, MHRD/TSG. Inconsistent data will not be accepted by MHRD, therefore States may not get benefit of Schemes.

Web Monitoring System

UDISE code is mandatory for each school if they are to be covered under RMSA , ICT@School, IEDSS and Vocational Education. The UDISE code for Strengthening, New Schools under RMSA and ICT@Schools which were sanctioned in the previous years should be entered on <http://59.177.241.196> (portal).

The teachers which have been posted for RMSA under New Schools, and additional teachers' detailed information should also be fed into the web monitoring system.

The detailed demonstration has already been given in the workshop on how to feed the UDISE code in the system. It is suggested that before submitting the AWP&B for year 2013-14, the UDISE code should entered on the <http://59.177.241.196>
