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CHAPTER- I

SUMMARY OF THE REPORT

- The method of random sampling were adopted for collection of information.
- As suggested 5% sample were drawn from the universe.
- There are 2111 primary and 519 upper primary schools in the District.
- As many as 134 schools (111 primary & 23 upper primary) were covered for survey.
- P.E=Post Enumeration
- D=Discrepancy

1. Teachers Qualification:

It was found that majority of the primary school head teachers are below undergraduate (71.17 %) and all of them had JBT training and also reveals that overwhelming majority of the upper primary school head teachers are post- graduate with B.Ed. training.

2. Experiences of Head Teacher:

It was found that majority of the primary and upper primary school head teachers have experiences up to 10 years. There are 5.41% of primary & 8.70 % upper primary school head teachers have experiences in between 11-20 years.

3. Year of School Establishment:

It was noticed that overwhelming majority of the sample primary schools are established after the post Independence. The sample upper primary schools are mostly established before Independence.

4. School Category:

The overwhelming majority of the sample primary schools are up to class-IV standard. The upper primary schools are mixed type and found that cent percent middle school with secondary section.

5. Type of School:

It was noticed that of the 111 sample primary schools only 2.70% are meant for girl students and rest are Co-education in nature. About 26.09% sample Upper primary schools are Co-educational and 56.52% are exclusively for girl students.

6. School Management:

It reveals that the entire sample schools both primary and upper primary are managed by the Education Department of Govt. of West Bengal

7. Residential School:

It was found that the entire sample primary schools are non-residential in nature except one each in primary and UPS. The same UPS hostel are managed by the Welfare Dept. of SC & ST and the primary school hostel are managed by other body.

8. Use of School Building used as shift School:

It reveals that there are 55(49.54%) primary schools and 5(21.74%) UPS buildings are in use on shifting basis mainly located at municipalities. AWW centers are common in using some portion of school building for running the activities.

9. Teachers position and Attendance:

a) It was found that as many as 389 teachers (M-241 F-157) are in position in all 111 primary schools and 267 teachers (M-89 F-178) are in position in all 23 upper primary schools on the survey period.

b) It was noticed that in the primary schools 90.87% male & 92.99% female teachers were present on the day of school visit and in upper primary schools 93.25 % male & 89.88% female teachers were present.

c) The Para teachers position of those schools are 68 (M-22 F-46) in primary and 57 (M-15 F-42) in upper primary schools.

10. Position of Non-Teaching Staff:

There is no provision of Non-teaching staff at primary level and in the UPS only non teaching staffs are placed there are 16 such staffs are available in the sample UPS. Besides, these days in view of women's empowerment, the cooking of MDM is managed by SHG members both at primary & upper primary schools.

11. Status of School Building:

It was found that there are 1 and 11(9.90%) sample primary schools are private and rented accommodation and all of the UPS buildings are constructed out of Govt. grants.

12. Type of School Building:

It was noticed that all the upper primary school buildings are pacca. In the primary schools it was found that 95.49% primary school buildings are pacca and 4.50% are partly pacca. There is no building less school in the District.

13. Number of Blocks in the School:

It was found that majority of the sample primary schools have up to 3 blocks & one school are in rented place . The 95.65% upper primary schools has up to 3 blocks & one school has more than 3 blocks.

14. Condition of classroom and other room:

- a) It was found that the sample primary schools have as many as 363 class rooms & 88 other rooms in good condition. The upper primary school has 288 class rooms & 97 other rooms is in good condition.

b) From the sample primary schools it was found that 48 class rooms & 29 other room needs minor repairing work. The 42 upper primary school class rooms & 23 other room needs minor repairing work.

c) It reveals that 36 primary school class rooms and 13 other rooms' needs major repairing work .It was also found that 23 class rooms and 5 other rooms of upper primary school class rooms needs major repairing work.

15. Availability of Electricity & Toilet:

a) It was found that 47.74 % primary schools and 0.90 % upper primary schools do not have electric connection.

b) In regard to the toilet facilities in the schools it was found that (7.20%) primary schools do not have the facility. It was also revealed that many of the toilets are used by the staff of school and mostly unclean.

16. Boundary Wall:

It was found that 55.85 % primary schools 21.73 % upper primary schools do not have boundary wall. It was noticed that the schools which has boundary wall are mostly pacca.

17. Drinking water facilities:

In regard to the drinking water facilities it was found that majority of the Primary schools have provision of drinking water by hand pump(84.68%) and (52.17%) for Upper Primary Schools and running tap water(47.82%) is most useful means. It was also revealed that 7.20% primary schools still do not have provision of drinking water.

18. Seating Arrangement:

It reveals that 30.63%of primary schools has furniture for all children and 43.04% of schools with some furniture. A sizable number of school students 43.04% sat on the floor. All the upper primary schools have furniture for seating arrangement.

19.Play Ground:

It reveals that there are 65.76%primary schools and 30.43% UPS do not have play ground.

20. Student Enrolment:

- a)** There are 1919 (B- 614 G-1005) repeaters in 23 upper primary schools and on the other hand as many as 831 (B-413 G-418) repeaters in 111 primary schools in 2007-08.
- b)** It was found that there are as many as 159 (B-86 G-73) physically challenged.
- c)** It was found that there are as many as 67 (B- 36 G-31) physically challenged drop sample upper primary schools in the year 2007-2008.

21. Student Attendance on the day of visit:

- a)** On the basis of information collected from the sample schools (primary) it was found that (B- 73.24% G-74.59%)students of class –I,(B-77.58% G-79.25%) students of class II,(B- 78.87% G-78.02%) students of class III,& (B-76.46% G-77.66%) students in class IV were present on the day of school visit.
- b)** The information regarding the student attendance on the day of school visit in the upper primary school are found to be(B-57.04% G-63.6%) students of class –v,(B-56.83% G- 60.82%)students of class vi,(B-56.98% G-64.29 %) students of class vii,& (B-57.62% G- 67.83%) students in class-viii were present on the day of school visit.

22. Grade wise Examination details:

- a)** On the basis of information collected from the primary school in the year 2007-08 and found that 98.30 % student of class IV appeared in final exams; out of 97.70 % students were qualified
- b)** It was found that 94.70 % student of class VIII appeared in final exams, out of 86.40 % student were qualified in 2007-08.
- c)** It was found that 93.90% boys and 95.17% girls students of class-IV appeared in the in the first and second terminal exams of 2008-09. Out of 100 % of boys and girls were qualified and from the class-VIII of upper primary schools97.4 % students appeared out of % students were qualified

23. Investigator feed back:

- a)** It has been observed that both primary & Upper primary schools were opened on the first day of school visit and all the information were collected from the single day of visit.
- b)** The initial reaction of head teacher, regarding the availability of records seems to be good.
- c)** The Investigator observations related to the common issues / questions are shown in the Tabular form. (enclosed)

CHAPTER- III

CATEGORY WISE ANALYSIS OF DISE-2009

1. Head teacher qualification:

It reveals that majority of the head teachers of primary schools are below under graduate and overwhelming majority of them are JBT trained. It was also noticed that 23.42% of the head teachers are school final pass (Madhyamik).

The overwhelming majority of the head teachers of upper primary school have post graduation degree with B.Ed.Training. However, it was noticed 26.09% head teacher of the upper primary schools are undergraduate.

9. Staff details (Teacher & Para Teacher position & attendance on the day of school visit)

In the Primary schools there is little scope to know the school wise sanctioned teacher post . Normally the District Primary Education Board adopts practice for primary school teacher posting on the basis of its enrolment and it was known that this practice is common in all over West Bengal. On the contrary, all the upper primary schools have information about the school wise sanctioned teacher post.

In the primary schools, it has been found that as many as 398 school teachers (male 241 & female 157) were in position out of there are 90.87% male & 92.99% female teachers were present on the day of the school visit. In regard to the para teachers it also reveals that as many as 68 para teachers (M-22 F-46) are in position of those sample primary schools.

In regard to the upper primary schools (23), it has been found that as many as 267 school teachers (M-89 & F-178) were in position. Among during the period of the field visit, it was found that 93.25% male teachers & 89.88% female teachers were present on the day of school visit. The para teachers' positions on those schools are 57(M-15, F-42).

CHAPTER- I

SUMMARY OF THE REPORT

- The method of random sampling were adopted.
- As suggested 5% sample were drawn from the universe.
- There are 3171 primary and 513 upper primary schools in the District.
- As many as 183 schools (159 primary & 24 upper primary) were covered for survey.
- P.E=Post Enumeration
- D= Discrepancies

1. Teachers Qualification:

It was found that majority of the primary school head teachers are below undergraduate (64.78 %) and all of them had JBT training.

It was also found that overwhelming majority of the upper primary school head teachers are post- graduate with B.Ed. training.

2. Experiences of Head Teacher:

It was found that majority of the primary and upper primary schools head teacher has experiences up to 10 years There are 12.58% of primary & 12.50 % upper primary school head teachers has more than 10 year experiences.

3. Year of School Establishment:

It was found that many of the sample primary and upper primary schools were established after 50s.

4. School Category:

It was noticed that the sample primary schools are mainly up to class IV standard. The upper primary schools are mixed category having middle and H.S section.

5. Type of School:

It was found that the majority of sample primary schools are Co-education in nature however, there are 1 and 2 schools are exclusively for boys and girls. From the sample Upper primary schools there are 25% and 33.33% are exclusively for boys and girls and rest 41.67% are Co-educational.

6. School Management:

It reveals that the entire sample schools both primary and upper primary are managed by the Education Department of Govt. of West Bengal.

7. Nature of School:

It was found that the entire sample primary schools are non-residential in nature.

8. Use of School Building:

It was noticed that shift schools are situated mainly in the municipal area. As many as 42.76% primary schools & 37.50% upper primary school buildings are used for the purpose. It was noticed that the AWW center and vocational training are running in many schools in the morning shift.

9. Teachers position and Attendance:

a) It was found that as many as 576 teachers (M-387 F-189) are in position in all 159 primary schools and 511 teachers (M-339 F-172) are in position in all 24 upper primary schools on the day of visit.

b) It was observed that in the primary schools 88.63% male & 82.01% female teachers were present on the day of school visit and in upper primary schools 89.68% male & 86.63% female teachers were present.

c) The Para teachers position of those schools are 180 (M-89 F-91) in primary and 162 (M-67 F-95) in upper primary schools.

d). There are 1.54% discrepancy found in regard to the teacher position similarly in the primary schools and in UPS there are 118.38% discrepancy in teacher position.

10. Position of Non-Teaching Staff:

a) There is hardly any Non-teaching staff at primary level these staffs are mainly placed in the UPS. However, there are SHG members both at primary & upper primary schools for MDM.

b) There are 81(male-60, female-21) non teaching staffs are available in all the sample UPS.

c) There is no discrepancy found in comparison with the DISE data in the primary schools however the discrepancy in the UPS are 8.00%.

11. Status of School Building:

None of the sample school building are private or in rented place all the school buildings are constructed out of Govt. grants.

12. Type of School Building:

There is no building less school in the District. All the sample schools buildings are pacca in nature.

13. Number of Blocks in the School:

It was found that except one sample primary school all have up to 3 blocks and 83.33% upper primary schools has up to 3 blocks and 16.67% of the school has more than 3 blocks. There is no discrepancy found in comparison with the DISE data in the primary schools but the discrepancy in the UPS are 100%(4 and above blocks).

14. Condition of classroom and other room:

a) It was found that the sample primary schools have as many as 547 class rooms & 161 other rooms in good condition. The upper primary school has 285 class rooms & 65 other rooms are in good condition.

b) From the sample primary schools it was found that 66 class rooms & 43 other room needs minor repairing work. The 63 upper primary school class rooms & 28 other room needs minor repairing work.

c) It reveals that 59 primary school class rooms and 62 other rooms' needs major repairing work .It was also found that 55 upper primary school class rooms and 21 other rooms needs major repairing work.

d) It was found that as many as 9 primary school class rooms & 11 other rooms are unfit for use. Similarly, 2 class rooms of upper primary school are unfit for use.

e) There are discrepancies found in comparison with the DISE data in this regard which are as follows;26.62% for good condition of class rooms,57.84% other rooms and the discrepancies for minor repairing are 10.81% primary school for class rooms and 19.44% for other rooms for major repairing work 48.25% class rooms and 17.33% other rooms.

The discrepancies in respect of the UPS are as follows;44.67% for good condition of class rooms,75.68% other rooms and the discrepancies for minor repairing are 21.15% for class rooms and 64.71% for other rooms for major repairing work 36.05% class rooms and 34.38%other rooms.

15. Availability of Electricity & Toilet:

a) It was found that 70.44 % primary schools and 4.17 % upper primary schools do not have electric connection.

16. Boundary Wall:

It was found that 63.52 % primary schools 23.34 % upper primary schools do not have boundary wall. It was noticed that the schools which has boundary wall are mostly pacca.

17. Drinking water facilities:

In regard to the drinking water facilities it was found that majority of the Primary schools have provision of drinking water by hand pump(94.97%) and for Upper Primary School(95.89%) which is most useful means. It was also revealed that 2.52% primary schools do not have provision of drinking water.

18. Seating Arrangement:

Floor is the common seating arrangement for the students of primary schools. However, it reveals that there are 4.40% primary schools have furniture for all. It was noticed that in many upper primary schools have adequate furniture for its students 87.50% .

19. Play Ground:

There are26.42% primary schools and 54.17% UPS have play ground.

20. Student Enrolment:

a) There are 2257 (B- 1172 G- 1085) in the sample primary schools and on the other hand as many as 3334 (B-1501 G- 1833) repeaters in the UPS in 2007-08.

b) It was found that there are as many as 394 (B-212 G-182) physically challenged in the year 2007-2008.

c) It was found that there are as many as 138 (B- 67 G-71) physically challenged in the sample upper primary schools in the year 2007-2008.

d) The information about repeaters in 2008-09 found that there are 2141 (B-1158 G-983) in the sample primary schools and on the other hand as many as 3065(B-1568 G-1497) repeaters in the UPS.

e) It was found that there are as many as 381 (B-207 G- 174) physically challenged in the sample primary schools in the year 2008-2009 and no information about school dropouts are available.

f) It was found that there are as many as 202 (B- 116 G-86) physically challenged and from the sample upper primary schools in the year 2008-2009 & no information about school dropouts are available.

21. Student Attendance on the day of visit:

a) On the basis of information collected from the sample schools (primary) it was found that (B- 61.73% G-65.90%)students of class –I,(B-64.08% G-65.98%) students of class II,(B- 61.20% G-67.00%) students of class III,& (B-62.47% G-65.45%) students in class IV were present on the day of school visit.

b) The information regarding the student attendance on the day of school visit in the upper primary school are found to be(B-75.72% G-45.75%) students of class –v,(B-70.54% G- 50.37%)students of class vi,(B-74.99% G-66.99 %) students of class vii,& (B-70.69% G- 65.62%) students in class-viii were present on the day of school visit.

22. Grade wise Examination details:

a) On the basis of information collected from the primary school in the year 2007-08 and found that 95.78 % student of class IV appeared in final exams; out of 97.38% students were qualified.

b) It was found that 96.39% student of class VIII appeared in final exams, out of 88.67 % student were qualified in 2007-08.

c) On the basis of information collected from the primary schools it was found that 92.22% student of class IV appeared in the terminal exams, out of 100 % student were qualified in the year 2008-09(First terminal).

d) It was found that 97.28% student of class VIII appeared in 2ND. Unit test , out of 96.96% student were qualified in 2008-09.

23. Investigator feed back:

- a) It has been observed that both primary & Upper primary schools were opened on the first day of school visit and all the information were collected from the single day of visit.
- b) The initial reaction of head teacher, regarding the availability of records seems to be good.
- c) The Investigator observations related to the common issues / questions are shown in the Tabular form. (enclosed)
